Course Description: The focus of the training programme is to empower Local Authority staff to promote behavioural change and encourage positive climate action across local communities. The training has been designed and developed to offer participants the knowledge and tools to become leaders in climate action by raising awareness, encouraging participation and inspiring action within and across local communities. The course invites people to connect with local communities to better tell the story of climate change, engage with local leaders to seek out opportunities to take positive action and inspire and support local initiatives that place communities at the forefront of a movement for positive climate action.

Course Aims: The training programme aims to help and guide participants to inspire and encourage positive climate action and promote behavioural change across local communities.

This training will support Local Authority staff to:

- Distinguish community types and consider appropriate strategies to engage and influence these communities.
- Explore ways to inspire and mobilise communities through communication of key climate information.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues (including the Climate Action Team) and elected members from across the local authority, with other local authorities and external agencies to engage and work with community groups.
- Bring together members of their local community and / or other organisations to collaborate on climate campaigns and projects.

Entry Requirement: To participant on this training programme, it is desirable that you have completed one of the following Climate Action Training Programmes: Raising Awareness, Building Capacity or

Championing Leadership. These training programmes will have provided base line training on both science and policy.
